"A Spark in the Emerald Forest" depicts a moment of truth in the story of Khosrow and Shirin, the moment when two hearts 'reconnect' with one another while amongst Nature. Nature is where the pulse and heartbeat of the Divine emanate in its purest and most potent form, uplifting both heart and spirit and reminding us of our connectedness; helping us to recognise the same Divine spirit within one another.

Khosrow and Shirin, in this scene, experience a moment of pure love, emanating from their spiritual hearts that recognise one another despite their earthly manifestation never have met. The river between them represents the flow of love, energy and truth. It amplifies the awareness of their spiritual origins from the same ultimate Source. This affinity they feel is a sense of wholeness that comes from recognising the Divine reflection in one other.

Occurring in a wild forest, there are no man-made structures in sight, only emerald lands and glistening waters bathed in golden light. Nature, in its perfectly balanced harmony, acts as a concert platform, igniting a sense of togetherness and unity between Man, Nature and Spirit.

This sense of unity is something that we can all strive for by consciously working to recognise the spark within each other and the world around us. This is our opportunity to form a collective movement toward understanding that we are all one and part of the same Whole.

The series' overarching theme revolves around drawing on ancient metaphors related to chaos/order and human interactions with themselves and their environment, taken from classical mythology or religious narrative art, and then subverting them to offer a tongue-in-cheek social critique...

The minotaur was birthed from a profane union between King Minos' wife, Pasiphae, and a bull destined to be sacrificed to Poseidon. This creature resided in a maze built by King Minos and consumed Athenian boys and girls, seven of each, every three years. The minotaur symbolises humanity's darkest traits: bestial, unnatural, bloodthirsty, murderous, residing in shadows and chaos, and preying upon the young and innocent.

In this artwork, the minotaur is not confined to the labyrinth but is elevated atop a pillar in the sky - a stark contrast to its natural habitat. It cradles a freshly hatched chick in its hands, symbolising rebirth, the advent of spring, new beginnings, and the delicate nature of life itself.

Through this imagery, the artist implies that as we reflect on the fragility of nature in light of our reckless actions, we may reconsider our paths. The telescope-eyed goldfish bear witness to this revelation, akin to angels in a Renaissance nativity scene.

The artist frequently employs these fish as messengers or observers of the wondrous, given their eyes appear perpetually astounded by the magnitude of unfolding events. Their elongated fins mirror the flowing robes of Renaissance angels. Behind them lingers the idiom "a fish out of water", suggesting that they, much like the minotaur, are removed from their natural surroundings - an exact inversion, in fact.

Similarly to the minotaur, they are products of human intervention in their breeding process - descendants of carp that, due to extensive inbreeding, now possess these remarkable eyes and elongated fins. The entire juxtaposition is

intended to be whimsical and light-hearted - after all, who are we (or even the artist himself) to pontificate! The vibrant use of colour and brushwork underlines this sentiment. Yet, this doesn't diminish the artist's concerns about humanity's harmful interactions with their environment, exacerbated by deeply rooted belief systems and societal constructs.

Experience the evocative power of this artwork. This piece reveals a universe with two non-gendered figures: dark and light. They share an intimate and ambiguous moment. The dark figure rests on the light figure's lap, surrounded by crimson, rabbit-shaped infants.

Notice the hallucinogenic mushrooms on the dark figure's chest, symbols of power that evoke both fear and comfort.

Dangerosa's detailed work adds layers of meaning, making the scene feel warm or sinister, depending on the viewer's perspective.

As with many of Dangerosa's works, this painting challenges our perceptions and emotions. It reflects the dualities within us: dark and light, comfort and fear, birth and decay.

This painting invites us to contemplate life's cycles and the ebb and flow of our existence.
